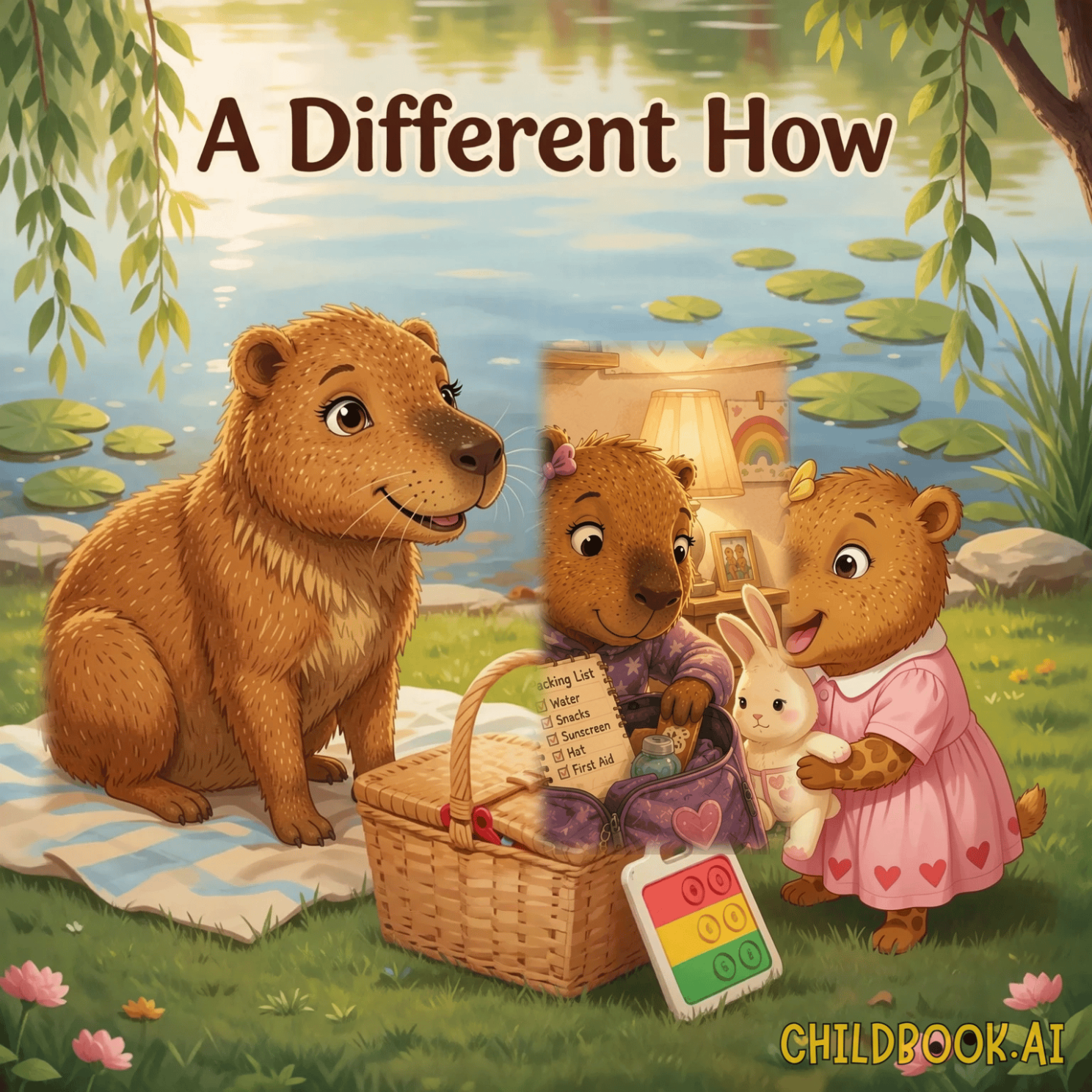


A Different How
